Summary

Images from the "Microsoft Office Images" service have been incorporated into *Scott Bradford*: Off *on a Tangent*. Their use is governed by the relevant licensing terms that were in effect at the time they were obtained.

Scott Bradford accessed the service and downloaded the images as a licensed user of *Microsoft Office 2008 for Mac.* The applicable terms are that product's <u>Software License Terms</u>, Microsoft's <u>Service Agreement</u>, and Microsoft's policies on the <u>Use of Microsoft Copyrighted Content</u>.

As described in those documents, Scott Bradford was authorized to access and use the "Microsoft Office Images" service, to "copy and use the media elements in projects and documents," and to "distribute those documents and projects non-commercially" (i.e., not for direct sale).

The "Microsoft Office Images" service was discontinued in 2014 and the above-described documents are now difficult to find. The purpose of this document is to consolidate the relevant sections and provide links to available source material.
